
Fati played football







Fati stirred the soup twice.






Then, Fati looked at her mother.

She was cutting green leaves for the soup.









Her mother was not looking her way.

She was cutting garden eggs for the soup.




Fati quickly took a second piece of meat from the pot and ate it.

Fati said, "Mmm! Mmm!"




Once more, Fati looked at her mother.


Her mother was not looking her way.




Fati very quickly took a third piece of meat from the pot and ate it too!




Soon, Mother came to the fire with the green leaves, garden eggs and okro.

and took the spoon from Fati.






When Mother served the soup,

Fati did not get any meat.


Fati said, "Mother, I am sorry.
