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Christopher Columbus was a European explorer.



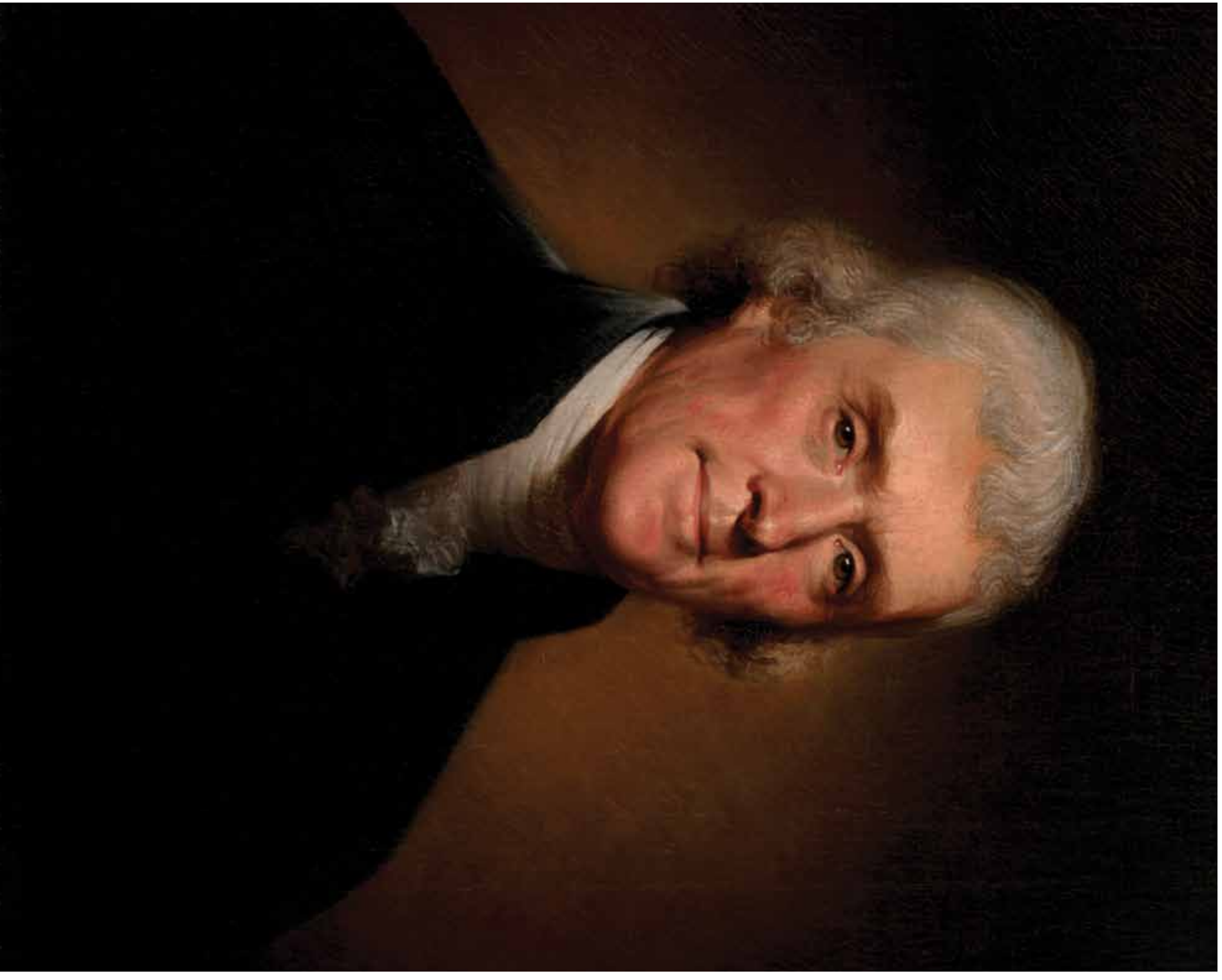
Pilgrims were early settlers of North America.



The Boston Tea Party helped to start the American Revolution.



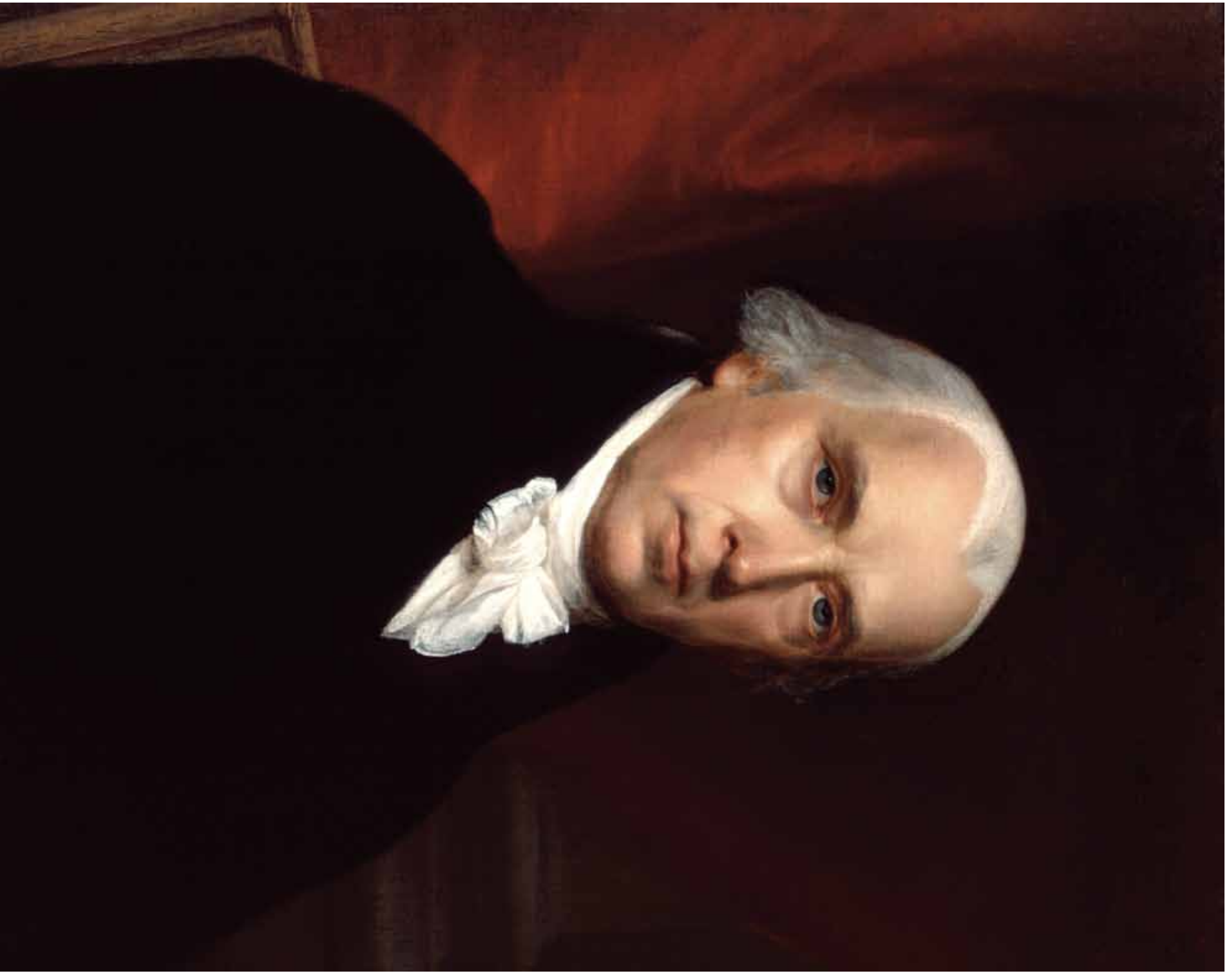
Paul Revere warned colonists of the approaching British attack.

Washington, D.C., was burned in 1814 by the British.



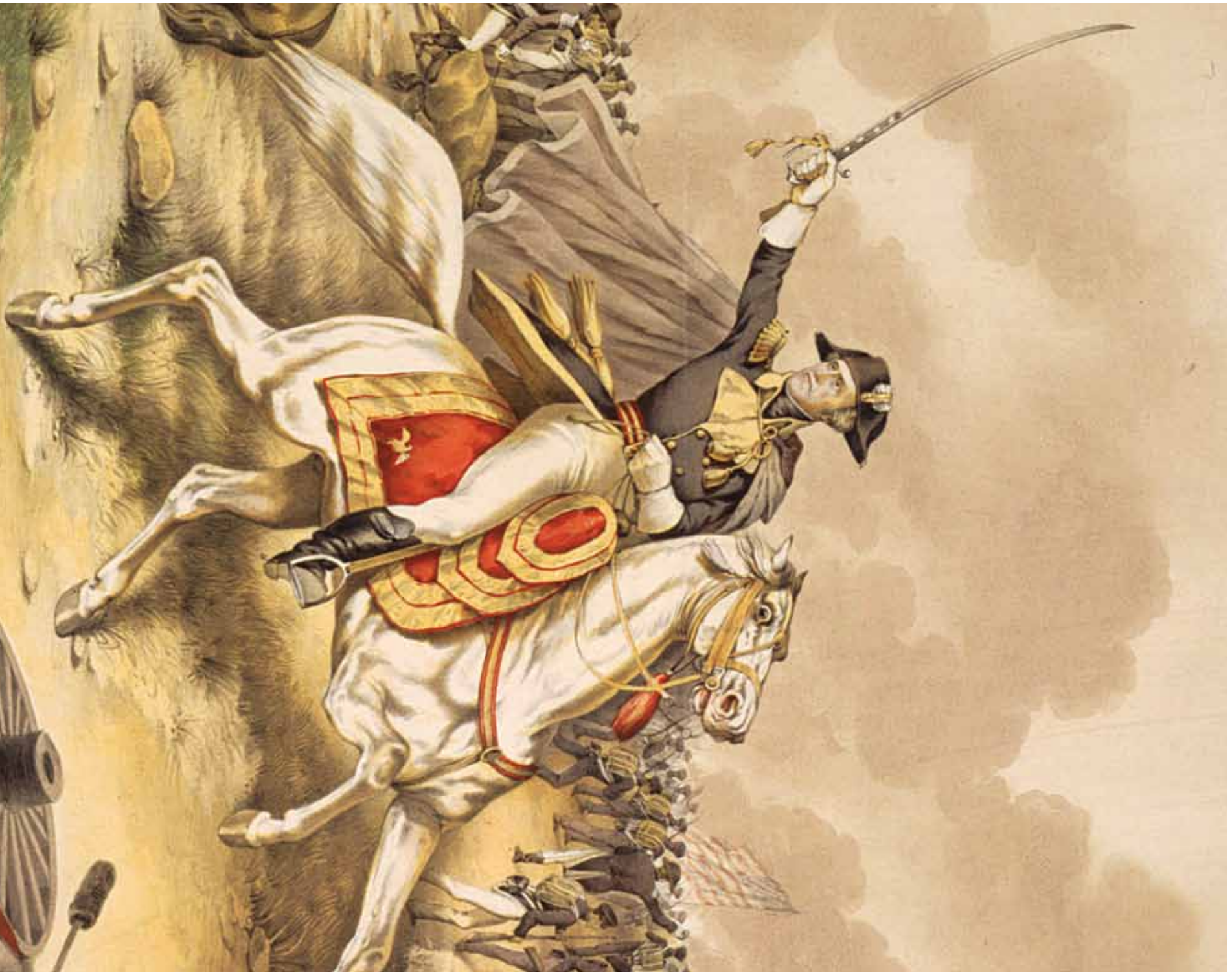
The British attacked Fort M'Henry in Baltimore.



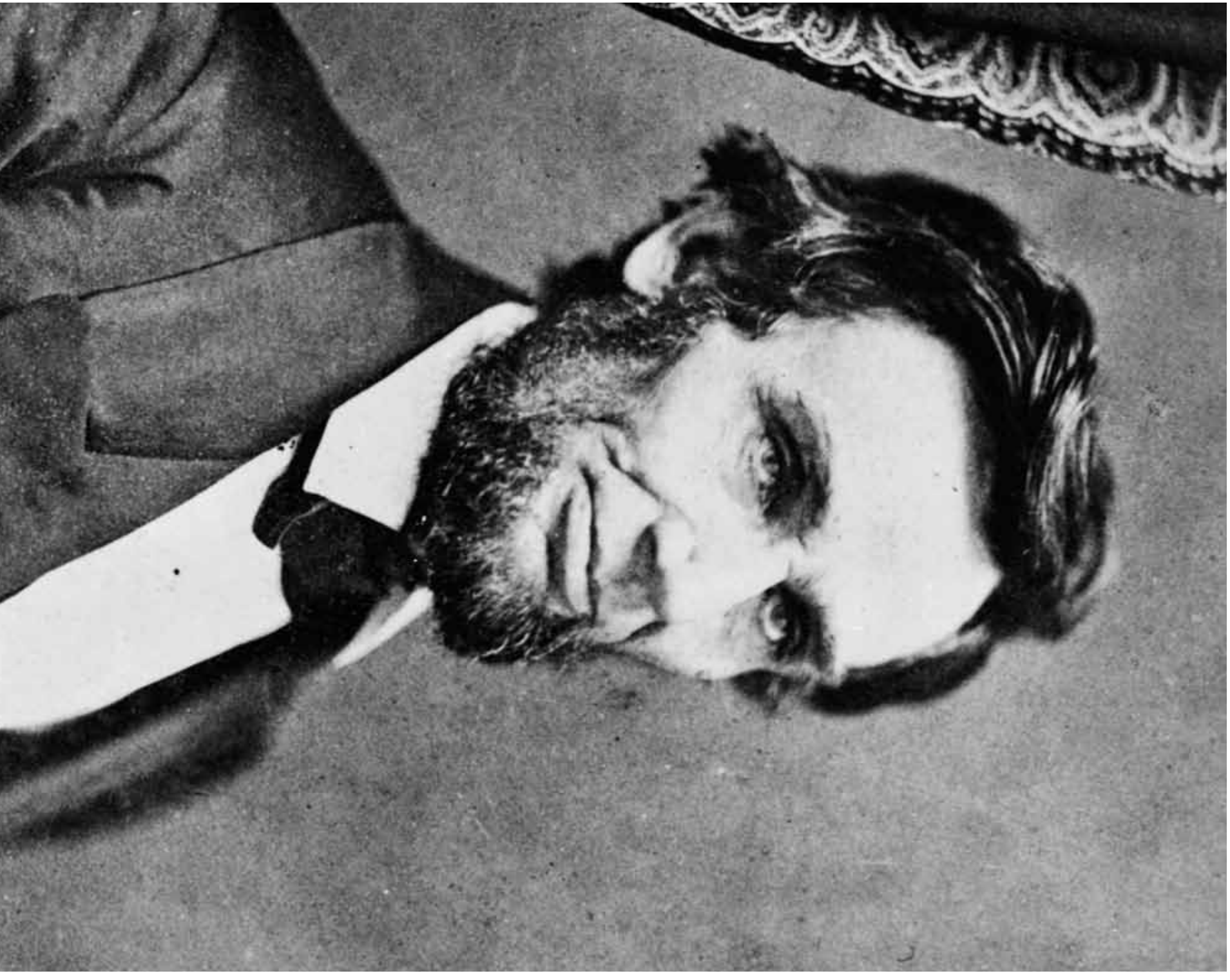
Francis Scott Key wrote "The Star-Spangled Banner."



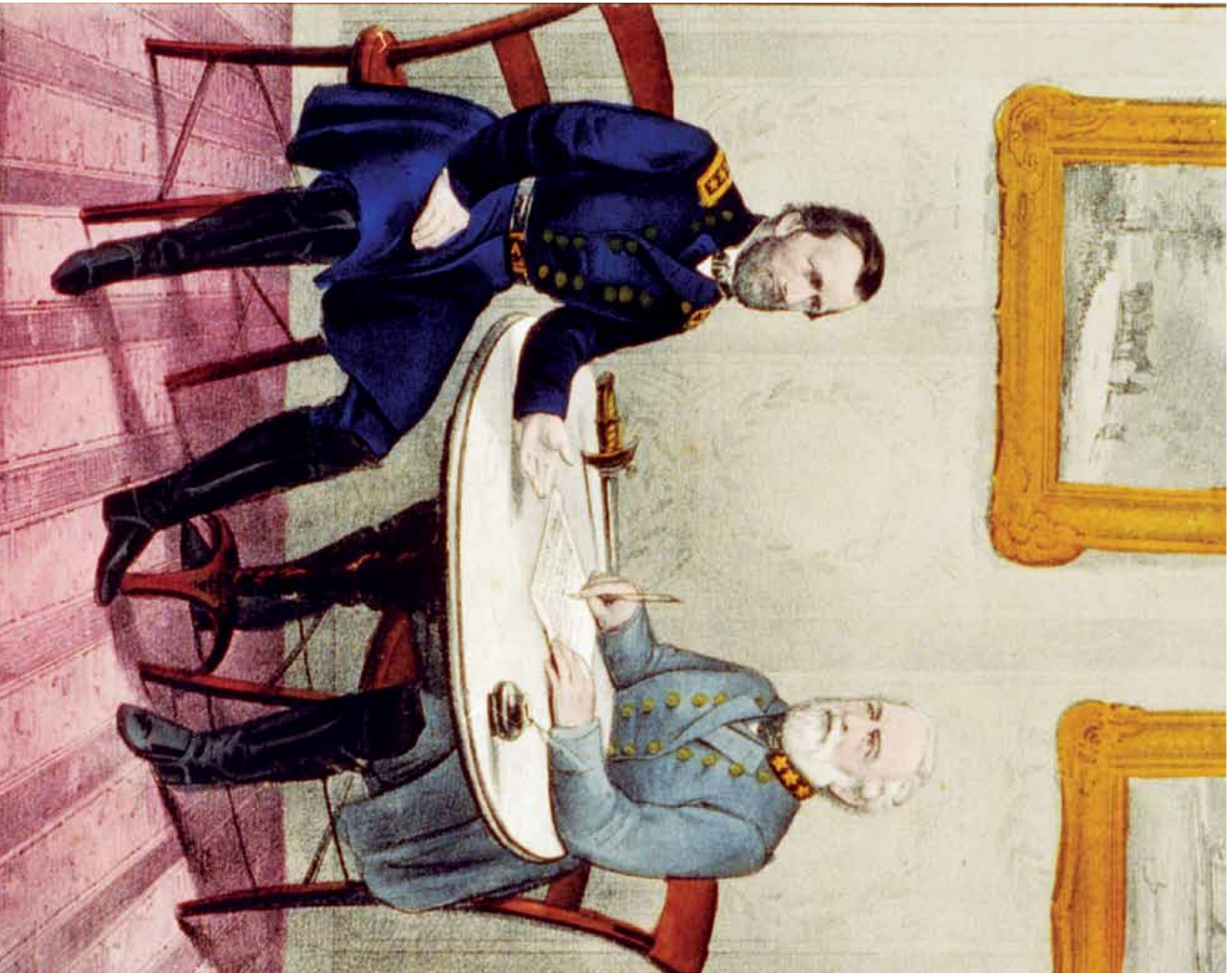
The Battle of New Orleans was a victory for the United States.
