At the flourmill, wheat for bread making is processed. This means the wheat is graded, cleaned, blended, soaked, ground, sifted and ground again to make flour.

Firstly, wheat is inspected and graded for quality before it is sorted into groups. Different wheats are used for different products. Several grades of wheat are usually blended to make different kinds of flour. Soft wheat is used for biscuits and hard wheat is used for bread.

Grain is cleaned to remove any stones, dust and weed seeds. It is soaked in water for 10 to 20 hours. This toughens the outer bran layer to make it easier to separate, and softens the inner endosperm, which is used to make flour.
