

Key facts about pupil learning, teaching and school management in **Kono District**




This factsheet is based on findings from the Secondary Grade Learning Assessment (2018).

Fact 1

In Kono, learning levels of JSS2 and SSS2 pupils are low in both English and Mathematics.






Average learning levels in Kono are higher than the national average amongst JSS2 and SSS2 pupils

Fact 2


In Kono, JSS2 girls score higher than JSS2 boys, but SSS2 girls score lower than SSS2 boys.




Fact 3

In Kono, at SSS2 level, pupils from wealthier households perform better than pupils from poorer households. However, poor JSS2 pupils perform better in English than wealthy JSS2 pupils.

Fact 4

In Kono, a small percentage of JSS and SSS teachers are female. Teacher characteristics in Kono are similar to the national average statistics.

Fact 7

93% of JSS teachers now use printed MBSSE lesson plans in Kono. However, 62% of these teachers find it difficult to link learning objectives to the appropriate grade level.

In Kono, a similar fraction of teachers make the right links, as at the national level, where only 4 in 10 teachers are able to do so

Fact 6

A typical JSS school in Kono has 23 pupils per teacher. The pupil-teacher ratio is similar in JSS and SSS schools.

Lesson observations in Kono are conducted in almost every school.

Nearly all schools in Kono have parent-teacher or community-teacher associations. Most of these bodies are active, having met at-least once in the current or previous term
